



WHERE: Veterans Memorial Park, Southwest Ave, Windsor Locks

WHEN: Friday June 28th at 9:30pm

PARKING: FREE parking is provided on the grounds. There is no parking on the side streets around the park. Streets are marked with no parking stakes. There is no public parking in front of 124 Southwest Ave (This is for Permitted Housing Residents) or along the side of 124 Southwest Ave (This is for WLFD Members and Apparatus ONLY).

As you enter the park at the main entrance, the paved lot immediately to the right along Southwest Ave is reserved for Permitted Handicap Vehicles only. The General Public Parking will proceed down the roadway along the carnival to the back lot where parking is allowed. Parking is usually full, so arrive early. Once the lots are full the park will be closed and you can park at the WLHS and walk over using the South Elm St entrance which is marked EXIT on the map.

LEAVING: We recommend the majority of the vehicles use the EXIT to the rear onto South Elm St. Vehicles can also exit back towards the entrance onto Southwest Ave.

NOTES: There are areas around the main baseball field that are roped off with FIRE LINE tape. BY STATE LAW, NO UNAUTHORIZED PERSONNEL ARE ALLOWED INSIDE THIS AREA. Please help us by staying out of this area. It is for your own protection and to keep everyone SAFE! There are plenty of great viewing areas from both soccer fields and the softball field, as well as the carnival.

PARKING NOTE FOR THE PARADE on SAT: The upper lot just in from Southwest Ave will be desingated for FIRE APPARATUS ONLY. Please use other areas of the park for parking on Parade day.

Safety Message About Smoke Alarms

Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. Working smoke alarms give you early warning so you can get outside quickly.

- A closed door may slow the spread of smoke, heat and fire. Install smoke alarms in every sleeping room and outside each separate sleeping area. Install alarms on every level of the home. Install alarms in the basement. Smoke alarms should be interconnected. When one sounds, they all sound.
- Large homes may need extra smoke alarms.
- It is best to use interconnected smoke alarms. When one smoke alarm sounds they all sound.
- Test all smoke alarms at least once a month. Press the test button to be sure the alarm is working.
- Today's smoke alarms will be more technologically advanced to respond to a multitude of fire conditions, yet mitigate false alarms.
- A smoke alarm should be on the ceiling or high on a wall. Keep smoke alarms away from the kitchen to reduce false alarms. They should be at least 10 feet (3 meters) from the stove.
- People who are hard-of-hearing or deaf can use special alarms. These alarms have strobe lights and bed shakers.
- Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old.
- Smoke alarms are an important part of a home fire escape plan.

Summer Electrical Safety



- If you are putting in a new pool, hot tub, or spa be sure the wiring is performed by an electrician experienced in the special safety requirements for these types of installations.
- Outdoor receptacles must have covers that keep them dry even when appliances are plugged into them.
- Ground-fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) are special devices designed to protect against electric shock and electrocution. They are required for most pool, spa or hot tub equipment. They may be in the form of an outlet or a circuit breaker. Test the GFCIs monthly according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Electrical appliances, equipment, and cords should be kept at least 6 feet away from the water. When possible, use battery operated appliances and equipment, such as televisions, radios, and stereos.
- Avoid handling electrical devices when you are wet.
- Make sure that any overhead lines maintain the proper distance over a pool and other structures, such as a diving board. If unsure, contact a qualified electrician or your local utility company to make sure power lines are a safe distance away.
- Do not swim during a thunderstorm.
- Have a qualified electrician periodically inspect and where necessary—replace or upgrade the electrical devices or equipment that keep your pool, spa, or hot tub electrically safe.
- Have a qualified electrician show you how to turn off all power in case of an emergency.

KNOW THE RISKS!

Electrocution is death by an electrical shock. Be aware when skin is wet or when surrounding surfaces, such as the grass or pool deck, are wet. Wet skin or wet surfaces can greatly increase the chance of electrocution when electricity is present.

There are several signs of electrical shock. Swimmers may feel a tingling sensation. They may experience muscle cramps. They may not be able to move. They may feel as if something is holding them in place.

If you think someone in the water is being shocked, turn off all power, but do not attempt to go in the water Use a fiberglass or other kind of rescue hook that doesn't conduct electricity to help the swimmer. Have someone call 9-1-1.

If you think you are being shocked while in the water move away from the source of the shock. Get out of the water.

FACT

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety
Commission has reports of 14 deaths related
to electrocutions in swimming pools from
2003 to 2014. Hot tubs and spas may present
the same hazard as swimming pools.



Check Your Smoke Alarms

Hear the BEEP where you SLEEP





Test alarms at least once a month by pushing the test button.



Replace all smoke alarms when they are 10 years old or if they do not sound when tested.



Some people, especially children and older adults, may need help to wake up. Make sure someone will wake them if the smoke alarm sounds.



When the smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside. Go to your outside meeting place.



Call the fire department from a cellphone or a neighbor's phone. Stay outside until the fire department says it's safe to go back inside.

Home Heating Safety

General Rules for Heating Your Home

- Select heating equipment that is rated by the manufacturer for the size space you intend to heat.
- Have any installation done by a professional, if possible, and make sure all fuel-burning equipment is vented to the outside.
- Keep your heating equipment and anything that can burn at least 3 feet apart.
- Have your heating equipment inspected and cleaned every fall just before heating season.
- Never use or store flammable or combustible liquids near or in rooms with heaters.
- Make sure your heating equipment is allowed in your community.
- Install carbon monoxide alarms in your home.
- Cooking appliances should not be used to heat a home.

2017 Fire Prevention Week

In a fire, seconds count. Seconds can mean the difference between residents of our community escaping safely from a fire or having their lives end in tragedy.

That's why this year's Fire Prevention Week theme: "Every Second Counts: Plan 2 Ways Out!" is so important. It reinforces why everyone needs to have an escape plan. Here's this year's key campaign messages:

- Draw a map of your home (PDF) with all members of your household, marking two exits from each room and a path to the outside from each exit.
- Practice your home fire drill twice a year. Conduct one at night and one during the day with everyone in your home, and practice using different ways out.
- Teach children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- Make sure the number of your home is clearly marked and easy for the fire department to find.
- Close doors behind you as you leave this may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire.
- Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.

- Test your smoke alarms every month.
- When a smoke alarm sounds, get outside and stay outside.
- Replace all smoke alarms in your home every 10 years

Former Deputy Chief Charles Wezowicz Passes Away




